The contest winner will be awarded a \$2000 scholarship to be paid to the college of their choice in their freshman semester and will also be invited to attend the KCA Winter Convention to be held in Louisville Kentucky this year to accept the award.

#### **Essay Prompt:**

### How could concrete be used to make life better for people in your local community?

Like last year year, the essay submission process is different from previous years, so please pay close attention, as **paper submissions will not be accepted**.

The essay contest rules are as follows:

- o Student must be a current senior in high school graduating in the 2019 2020 school year.
- o Essays must address the essay prompt directly.
- o Essays must be a written by a single student, and shall not be collaborative in nature.
- o Essays must be submitted using the online submission form
- o Essays must be received by November 4th, 2019 at 11:59PM Eastern
- o Essays must be limited to 600 words

## **Hagan Scholarship Foundation**

Deadline: Students must apply online by November 15, 2019.

Eligibility Requirements: 1. Must be a US Citizen and Must be a resident of an eligible state.

2. Must be a student in the 2020 high school graduating class. 3. Must have achieved a 3.75 GPA or higher. 4. Must score 24 or higher on the ACT composite. 5. Must enroll in a four year college the fall semester following high school graduation. 6. Must work 240 hours in the 12 months prior to the start of each academic year of college. 7. Must complete the FAFSA in 2019 using 2018 tax information. FAFSA EFC must be less than \$6,500. 8. Must apply for eligible Federal and State grants. 9. Must not have been convicted of a felony.

Apply to the Nation's Oldest and Most Prestigious STEM Research Competition: Regeneron STS

- The Regeneron Science Talent Search 2020 <u>application</u> is now open! High school seniors with individual, original research projects are invited to apply online to the Regeneron STS. There are no limits to the number of students who can enter from any school, region or state, and students may submit research from any year of high school. The program is completely free.
- The top 300 scholars receive \$2,000 each, and their schools also receive \$2,000—that's funding for STEM education in your community. Forty finalists will be invited to compete in the finals week competition in Washington, DC, all expenses paid. Every finalist receives at least \$25,000 and if named in the top 10, could win between \$40,000 and \$250,000.
